### PROPOSAL OF EVENTS TO BE HELD

## Theme: “Restorative Justice as a catalyst for unity, healing and transformation”.

#### *Purpose*

The Events of Restorative Justice Week 2014 will be based on **deepening understanding of the different applications of Restorative Justice in Jamaica, with particular focus on healing and transformation.**

The main goals of the Restorative Justice week of events are to raise public awareness and build support for the Restorative Justice Programme as well as to invite national participation and collaboration with the government in implementing this effective Model of Justice.

#### *Specific Objectives Include:*

1. Increase public awareness of Restorative Justice Programme in Jamaica throughout the island and in specific target sectors.
2. To increase the motivation of Jamaicans to support and participate in the Restorative Justice Programme.
3. To increase the knowledge of Restorative Justice among key implementing partners and to meaningfully engage the educational sector in restorative practices.

#### *Expected Outcomes*

1. Jamaicans will be aware of and understand the applications of Restorative Justice.

2. Key sectors in Jamaica will become aware of and involved in Restorative Justice in their respective fields.
